

MAIDSTONE RCMP REPORT

For the dates of: May 7 2026, – May 20, 2026, Maidstone RCMP responded to 132 calls for service, some of which include:

2 traffic collisions
18 provincial traffic offences

CALLS FOR SERVICE:

- On May 7, members responded to a report of a vehicle stuck in field in the RM of Paynton. The vehicle was not reported stolen and was left for the owner to resolve.
- On May 7, members received a report of fence construction dispute in the RM of Eldon. Matter was found to be civil.
- On May 7, members responded to a noise complaint in Town of Marshall. Offending party was asked to turn down their music and they complied.
- On May 8, members responded to an unwanted person in the Town of Maidstone. The unwanted person was found to be on conditions to not be at the location. As a result of investigation, an adult female was charged with one count of failing to comply with a release order, was held to appear in court, then released by court for a future appearance date.
- On May 8, members responded to an unwanted person in the Town of Lashburn. Members provide a courtesy ride for the unwanted to person to another residence.
- On May 10, members responded to a noise complaint in the RM of Britannia. Arriving on scene, members heard no noise and did not observe any ongoing disturbance.
- On May 10, members responded to a complaint of an intoxicated and aggressive person at a residence in the RM of Britannia. Members attended and found the person passed out in an inoperable vehicle. The person lived at this residence and now that he had calmed down family allowed him to go inside.
- On May 10, members responded to a mental health assistance file in the Town of Lashburn. Members attended and located an adult male suffering from mental health issue and requesting assistance. Members provided a courtesy ride to Battleford Hospital.
- On May 10, members responded to a report of an aggressive intoxicated person at a residence in the RM of Britannia. Members attended and relocated the person to a different residence.
- On May 11, members received a report of money stolen from a residence in the Town of Waseca. The residence showed no signs of forced entry and there are no leads or suspects at this time.
- On May 11, members received a report of a suspicious person on a decommissioned oil site in the RM of Britannia. Members attended and located an adult male. Male issued a trespass notice on behalf of CNRL and escorted from the property.
- On May 11, members responded to report of a suspicious vehicle with two people sleeping in it on a dead-end road in the Town of Marshall. Members attended and vehicle had left.
- On May 11, members responded to a report of an adult male threatening self-harm in the Town of Lashburn. Members attended, apprehended the male under the Mental Health Act, and transported him to the Battleford Hospital for treatment.
- On May 11, Khaled ABDIRAHMAN turned himself in at the Maidstone RCMP Detachment for his outstanding warrant from Yorkton SK. Khaled ABDIRAHMAN held in custody at the Maidstone Detachment to appear in court and was later released by the court.
- On May 12, members responded to a complaint of people camping in an alley in the Town of Lashburn. When members arrived the tent and people were already gone.
- On May 12, members responded to an assault complaint in the Town of Lashburn. As a result of investigation one male was charged with assault and is scheduled to appear in court at a later date.
- On May 13, members responded to a complaint of a stolen silver Ford Edge SK license plate 977JZG in the Town of Lashburn. There are no leads or suspects at this time.

- On May 14, members responded to a 911 static line call from a business in the Town of Maidstone. Members spoke with staff on site and determined weather was interfering with the landline.
- On May 14, members responded to a report of unwanted persons at a residence in the Town of Maidstone. Investigation showed that this was a civil matter between a landlord and tenant.
- On May 14, members received a report of an assault that occurred several days prior in the Town of Maidstone. Matter is still under investigation.
- On May 14, members responded to an assault complaint in Town of Maidstone. Investigation showed no criminal assault happened, verbal dispute did occur. Members mediated and separated parties.
- On May 14, members responded to a property dispute in the Town of Maidstone. Members attended and mediated the situation.
- On May 14, members responded to a threat complaint in the Town of Waseca. Investigation showed that the person involved was a youth and no criminal activity occurred. Matter referred to CFS for follow-up.
- On May 15, members received a report of a male and female walking south on 17 Highway in the RM of Britannia during poor weather. Members conducted patrols but were unable to locate any persons in the area.
- On May 16, members received a report of a stolen Canam Commander from a property in the RM of Eldon. There are no leads or suspects at this time.
- On May 17, members responded to a third-party report of an assault at a residence in the RM of Britannia. Members attended and neither party involved in the report cooperated with the investigation. No evidence that any assault had occurred. Parties separated.
- On May 17, members received a report of historical sexual assault that occurred in the RM of Britannia. Matter is still under investigation.
- On May 17, members responded to a landlord tenant dispute in the RM of Britannia. Members attended to mediate and one party had left the residence.
- On May 17, members received a child welfare complaint in the Town of Maidstone. Members attended and confirmed child safety. Matter found to be a parenting issued and a referral was made to CFS to follow-up.
- On May 18, members responded to a noise complaint in the Town of Waseca. Members were already patrolling this area when the complaint was received but heard no noise. Additional patrols made but were unable to locate any noise.
- On May 18, members responded to a report of unwanted persons at a residence in the Town of Lashburn. Members attended and three people were relocated to a different residence.
- On May 19, members responded to a report of a person sleeping in a van on a range road in the RM of Eldon. Members located the vehicle and spoke with the driver. Nothing criminal noted.
- On May 19, RM of Wilton Police referred a file for theft of tools that had occurred in the RM of Wilton Business Park. There are no leads or suspects at this time.
- On May 19, members responded to a report of loud yelling happening at a residence in the Town of Maidstone. Members attended and found that a male and female had been loudly arguing. No indication of anything criminal occurring. Parties were separated.
- Members responded to report of a suspicious vehicle on a lease site in the RM of Britannia. Members located the vehicle and spoke with driver who stated that they had run out of gas. Driver given a ride to Lloydminster.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

- On May 8, members responded to a complaint of an erratic driver on 16 Highway in the RM of Wilton. Vehicle reported to be speeding to swerve and cut in front of complainant. Members located and stopped the vehicle. Suspect driver reported the other driver flipping them off and driving aggressively. Neither party agreed to provide a statement. No charges laid and verbal warnings issued.
- On May 8, members received a report of a vehicle driving erratically on the roadway and private property in the RM of Wilton. Members from Maidstone, Lloydminster, and Wilton Police Service responded. Vehicle was located and driver issued a license suspension and fines.
- On May 12, members received report of a suspected impaired driver on 16 Highway in the RM of Eldon. Vehicle was located and driver found to be sober and nothing criminal noted.

- On May 14, members responded to a two-vehicle collision on 16 Highway the RM of Wilton. A passenger vehicle and driven into the rear of a pickup truck. No injuries were reported and both vehicles were drivable. Written warning issued for following too closely.
- On May 14, members responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle on 17 Highway in the RM of Britannia. Vehicle found to be off of the roadway and not reported stolen. Vehicle was wrapped in police tape and left for the owner to resolve.
- On May 16, members responded to a single-vehicle roll-over on range road in the RM of Eldon. A commercial vehicle with trailer of sour produced water rolled into a ditch. Spill response contacted and the vehicle driver was taken to hospital for treatment of minor injuries.
- On May 17, members received a report of an abandoned vehicle along a secondary road in the RM of Eldon. Vehicle was not reported stolen and was off of the roadway. Vehicle left for the owner to resolve.
- On May 19, members received a report of an abandoned vehicle on 16 Highway in the RM of Eldon. Members attended found that the vehicle was not reported stolen and off of the roadway. Vehicle wrapped in police tape and left for the owner to resolve.

VULNERABLE SECTOR CHECKS

A vulnerable sector check is a police information check plus a check to see if a person has a record suspension (pardon) for sexual offences. Vulnerable sector checks were created in 2000 to protect children and vulnerable persons and is governed by section 6.3(3) of the [Criminal Records Act](#). Policies and procedures related to vulnerable sector checks can be found in the [Dissemination of Criminal Record Information policy](#) and the *Ministerial Directive Concerning the Release of Criminal Record Information by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police*.

Employment or Volunteering in the Vulnerable Sector

People who volunteer or are employed in positions of trust or authority over children or vulnerable persons may be required to obtain a vulnerable sector check. **Being in a position of trust or authority is more than having random or chance care and authority with children or vulnerable persons.** To meet the legal requirements for a vulnerable sector check, **the nature of the position** must cause the person to have authority over, or trust of, children or vulnerable persons. A “vulnerable person” is defined as any person who, because of age, a disability, or other circumstances, whether temporary or permanent are: in a position of dependence on others or are otherwise at a greater risk than the general population of being harmed by a person in a position of authority or trust.

Process for getting a vulnerable sector check

The applicant must provide a letter from the organization clearly explaining how a position's duties meet the criteria for a VS check. Each letter is specific to the position and is used for that one application only. It can't be a generic form letter or be used for different positions. Details about the children or vulnerable persons (e.g. age, or other factors that can show how the person is vulnerable). If the position is volunteer, provide a letter from the organization stating the person will not be paid for services or any other personal expenses incurred.

Once the police service has determined that the **position** meets the requirements for a vulnerable sector check, a name-based search will be conducted. In some circumstances, you will be required to submit fingerprints to confirm your identity. The use of fingerprints ensures the accuracy of the identification process.

Denying vulnerable sector checks

The police service will use information submitted by the applicant to determine if the position meets the legal requirements to conduct a vulnerable sector check. If the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#) for a vulnerable sector check, the vulnerable sector check will not be completed.

Did you know?

It is an offence to conduct a vulnerable sector check if the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#).
