

R.M. OF BRITANNIA NO. 502 BYLAW

NO. 17-2026

**A BYLAW FOR ENTERING INTO THE RESCUE SERVICES AGREEMENT
WITH LLOYDMINSTER RESCUE SQUAD INC.**

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Britannia No. 502 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. The Rural Municipality of Britannia No. 502 is hereby authorized to enter into a rescue services agreement with Lloydminster Rescue Squad Inc., the terms of which are set out in Exhibit 'A', which is attached hereto and forms part of this bylaw.
2. The Reeve and Chief Administrative Officer of the Rural Municipality of Britannia No. 502 are hereby authorized to sign and execute the said arena property management agreement with Lloydminster Rescue Squad Inc, the terms of which are set out in Exhibit 'A', which is attached hereto and forms part of this bylaw.
3. Bylaw 32-2024 is hereby repealed.

RESCUE SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Rescue Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of **June 12, 2026** (the "Effective Date")

BETWEEN:

Lloydminster Rescue Squad Inc., a non-profit organization having its principal place of business at:

Lloydminster, SK

(the "Contractor")

AND

Rural Municipality of Britannia No. 502, a municipal government having its principal place of business at:

PO Box 661
Lloydminster, SK
S9V 0Y7
(the "Municipality")

The Contractor and the Municipality may each be referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the Municipality passed the following resolution on February 25, 2026:

Council Adoption of Referendum Petition Question

114/25 NEWMAN: Whereas, on February 17, 2026, a Petition for a Referendum on a Resolution was received by the CAO of the Rural Municipality of Britannia No. 502; and Whereas the Petition has been deemed by the CAO to be sufficient as per 132(2) of The Municipalities Act;

Be it resolved that, as per section 136(5) of The Municipalities Act, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Britannia No. 502 rescind resolution 393/25; and

Further be it resolved that the Rural Municipality of Britannia No. 502 enter into negotiations with the Lloydminster Rescue Squad for the purpose of attempting to execute an agreement similar to Bylaw 32-2024, A Bylaw for the Entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Lloydminster Rescue Squad Inc. that includes the following:

- \$100,000.00 annual payment to Lloydminster Rescue Squad Inc;
- Access to the RM of Britannia No. 502 shop located at Blk/Par C-Plan 102453689 Ext 0 to store equipment; and
- The start date of June 11, 2026, with a minimum three (3) year term.

Further, be it resolved that council acknowledge that this resolution is being passed in response to receiving the Petition for Referendum on the same matter and that this resolution is subject to section 140 of The Municipalities Act, the same as any resolution resulting from a referendum would have been.

CARRIED

WHEREAS, the Contractor is experienced and has provided rescue, emergency response, recovery, and related safety services in the past to the Municipality;

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to set out the terms and conditions under which the Contractor shall provide such services to the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Parties acknowledge the refusal of the Contractor to accept the Access to the RM of Britannia No. 502 shop located at Blk/Par C-Plan 102453689 Ext 0 to store equipment.



NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

1. SERVICES

1.1 The Contractor shall provide rescue and emergency response services to the Municipality, which may include, but are not limited to:

- Airboat Rescue and Response
- Farm Rescue and Response
- Medical Rescue and Response
- Motor Vehicle Collision Rescue and Response
- School Education Talks regarding rescue services
- Search and rescue for missing persons
- All terrain Vehicle Rescue and Response
- STARS Landing related to a motor vehicle collision incident
- Dog Therapy
- Traffic Control
- UAV (Drone) Response
- Underwater Recovery
- Vehicle Extraction Response
- Water and Ice Rescue.

(the "Services")

2. TERM

2.1 This Agreement shall commence on June 12, 2026, and shall continue until June 11, 2029, unless terminated earlier in accordance with this Agreement.

2.2 The Parties may renew or extend this Agreement by written mutual agreement.

2.3 Before the end of the agreement on June 11, 2029, the Municipality must provide public notice at least 21 days before the proposed amendment or repeal of this Agreement in accordance with section 140 (2) of *The Municipalities Act*.

3. COMPENSATION

3.1 In consideration for the Services, the Municipality shall pay the Contractor as follows:

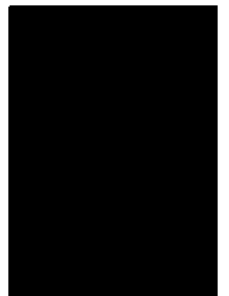
- \$100,000 payable on or before July 1, 2026, for the term of June 12, 2026, to June 11, 2027;
- \$110,000 payable on or before July 1, 2027, for the term of June 12, 2027, to June 11, 2028; and
- \$120,000 payable on or before July 1, 2028, for the term of June 12, 2028, to June 11, 2029.

3.2 The Contractor shall submit annual invoices to the Municipality, on or before June 15 to ensure payment by July 1.

3.3 The Parties acknowledge that the annual payment is a prepayment for the Services to be rendered during the term. If the Services are not provided for the full year for which the prepayment was made, the Contractor is required to reimburse the Municipality for any unearned revenue calculated in accordance with section 3.4 of this Agreement.

3.4 The Parties agree that revenue is earned as follows:

- Term of June 12, 2026, to June 11, 2027 – (\$100,000 annual payment / 365 days in the period = \$273.97 (daily rate);



- Term of June 12, 2027, to June 11, 2028 – (\$110,000 annual payment / 365 days in the period = \$301.36 (daily rate); and
- Term of June 12, 2028, to June 11, 2029 – (\$120,000 annual payment / 365 days in the period = \$328.76 (daily rate);

4. CONTRACTOR OBLIGATIONS

4.1 The Contractor shall:

- a. Maintain qualified and properly trained personnel;
- b. Maintain rescue equipment in safe working condition;
- c. Perform the Services in accordance with applicable laws, regulations, and industry standards;
- d. Maintain all required licenses, permits, and certifications;
- e. Carry and maintain the insurance required under this Agreement; and
- f. Maintain the ability to be dispatched from SPSA (Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency) and Sask 911 Call Centre to Motor Vehicle Collision accidents.

5. MUNICIPALITY OBLIGATIONS

5.1 The Municipality shall:

- a. Cooperate with the Contractor during rescue operations; and
- b. Pay all invoices in accordance with this Agreement.

6. EMERGENCY RESPONSE LIMITATIONS

6.1 The Contractor shall use commercially reasonable efforts to respond promptly to emergencies.

6.2 The Municipality acknowledges that response times and rescue outcomes may be affected by circumstances beyond the Contractor's reasonable control, including weather, road conditions, site accessibility, equipment failure, or unsafe conditions.

6.3 The Contractor agrees to request mutual aid from the Britannia Fire Department when required to ensure the Municipality receives the best possible response to any emergency incident.

7. INSURANCE

7.1 The Contractor shall obtain and maintain, at its sole costs, the following insurance coverage throughout the term of this Agreement and for a period of one year after completion:

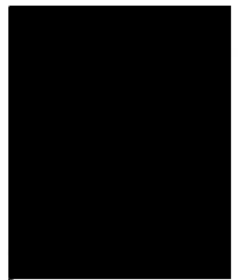
- Commercial General Liability Insurance in the amount of not less than \$5,000,000;
- Workers' Compensation coverage as required by law; and
- Automobile Liability Insurance in the amount of not less than \$5,000,000.

The insurance policies shall add the Municipality as an additional insured and provide that the coverage is primary.

7.2 Upon request, the Contractor shall provide proof of insurance coverage.

8. INDEMNIFICATION

8.1 Each Party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other Party from and against claims, damages, losses, liabilities, costs, and expenses arising out of the indemnifying Party's negligence, willful misconduct, or breach of this Agreement.



9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

9.1 To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall not be liable for indirect, incidental, consequential, or special damages.

9.2 Nothing in this Agreement shall limit liability for gross negligence, fraud, or willful misconduct.

10. CONFIDENTIALITY

10.1 Each Party agrees to keep confidential all non-public information obtained from the other Party and shall not disclose such information except as required by law or with prior written consent.

11. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

11.1 The Contractor is an independent contractor and nothing in this Agreement shall create any partnership, joint venture, employment, or agency relationship between the Parties.

12. TERMINATION

12.1 The Municipality may terminate this Agreement if:

- (a) the Contractor does not maintain the ability to be dispatched from SPSA (Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency) or the Sask 911 Call Centre.
- (b) the Contractor is unable to provide the Services indicated in section 1 of this Agreement.

It is mutually agreed that termination in accordance with this section is permitted by clause 140(1)(c) of *The Municipalities Act* as repeal of the bylaw authorizing this Agreement would be necessary to avert an imminent danger to the health and safety of the residents of the Municipality.

12.2 In the event this Agreement is terminated in accordance with section 12.1, the Contractor shall reimburse the Municipality for any unearned revenue calculated in accordance with section 3.4 of this Agreement.

13. FORCE MAJEURE

13.1 Neither Party shall be liable for delays or failures in performance caused by events beyond reasonable control, including natural disasters, severe weather, labor disputes, government actions, or emergencies.

15. GOVERNING LAW

15.1 This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of Saskatchewan and the federal laws applicable therein.

16. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

16.1 This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, discussions, and agreements relating to the subject matter herein.

16.2 Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by both Parties.

SEVERABILITY

17.1 If any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid, illegal or unenforceable, such provision shall be severed from this Agreement and the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE

18.1 Time is of the essence of this Agreement.
