

MAIDSTONE RCMP REPORT

For the dates of: April 23, 2026, – May 6, 2026, Maidstone RCMP responded to XXX calls for service, some of which include:

10 traffic collisions
58 provincial traffic offences

CALLS FOR SERVICE:

- On April 23, members received call of a person laying in the ditch on 17Hwy in the RM of Britannia. When members spoke with the caller they stated that they had driven the person to a gas station and left them there to arrange for a ride.
- On April 23, members received a request for a wellbeing check on a family member in Lashburn SK they hadn't heard from in a while. Members contacted the family member and found that they were staying with friends in another city.
- On April 23, members received report from an elderly woman in Maidstone SK stating that they had received a call from someone who sounded like their grand-daughter asking for \$8000 for bail money after causing a car accident. Caller called her grand-daughter's cell phone to confirm and discovered it was a scam attempt. No money or personal information was lost in this transaction.
- On April 24, members received report of an abandoned vehicle on 17Hwy in RM of Britannia. Investigation showed the vehicle was stolen from Meadow Lake SK and vehicle was towed for further investigation.
- On April 24, members responded to report of an assault in Maidstone SK. Investigation showed that an adult female had attacked an adult male with a knife. Adult male received minor injuries during the assault. Adult female arrested, charged, and held for court.
- On April 26, members received a report of a moose walking behind a house in Maidstone SK. SERN notified.
- On April 27, members received a report of a vehicle abandoned in a field with the front end submerged in the RM of Marshall. Members attended and found the vehicle to have been stolen from Lloydminster in November 2025. Due to field conditions, vehicle to be recovered at a later date.
- On April 28, members received a report of a vehicle abandoned in a field in the RM of Paynton. Investigation showed vehicle not stolen and left for owner to deal with.
- On April 28, members received a report of a suspicious person walking in the alley behind a residence in Maidstone SK. Members patrolled the area but were unable to locate anybody in the area.
- On April 28, members responded to report of an abandoned vehicle near 21Hwy in the RM of Eldon. Investigation showed vehicle was not stolen and when contacted the owner stated that the vehicle had broken down.
- On April 29, members received report of a landlord/tenant dispute in the RM of Britannia. Members spoke with caller and referred them to the Landlord Tenant Board for possible resolution.
- On April 30, members received a call from a commercial driver in the RM of Wilton who had been driving too fast and had to use his jake brake as he passed a house. The homeowner confronted the driver and he apologized. Driver just wanted to report in case of further complaints.
- On April 30, members received a report of a historical sexual assault that occurred in Maidstone SK. Matter still under investigation.
- On April 30, members responded to a call for assistance at a residence in the RM of Britannia. Members attended and found matter to be a civil property dispute between a separating couple.
- On April 30, members responded to a call in the RM of Wilton of a woman on 16Hwy throwing bottles into traffic. Patrols made but unable to locate anybody in area.

- On April 30, members responded to a call of a woman walking on 16Hwy near Lashburn and the caller felt that was suspicious. Members attended, located the woman, and gave her a ride to a safe location. (No indication that this woman was the bottle thrower).
- On April 30, in the RM of Britannia a member on patrol located an unoccupied vehicle parked on the side of the highway with fluids leaking from the front. Investigation showed nothing criminal and vehicle left for the owner to deal with.
- On May 01, in the Town of Maidstone members were called to check on an employee who failed to check in with their employer. Members attended and found the employee alive and well.
- On May 01, members were called to an unwanted person complaint in the RM of Britannia. Members found this to be a civil dispute between separating parties, mediated the situation, and the unwanted party left the residence.
- May 01, members were called to a mental health complaint in the Town of Lashburn where a person was threatening self-harm. Members located the individual who was apprehended for their safety and brought to hospital for evaluation.
- May 01, members responded to a noise complaint in the Town of Lashburn. Members advised the noise makers of the complaint and informed them of the noise bylaw.
- May 03, members responded to a report of a vehicle on fire on 17Hwy in the RM of Britannia (same vehicle located on May 01). There are no leads or investigational avenues at this time.
- May 03, members received report of a stolen quad, snowblower, and chainsaw from a property in the RM of Eldon. There are no leads or investigational avenues at this time. Members are seeking a yellow Can Am Outlander XMR 1000.
- May 03, members received a report of a stolen white Ford F150 AB license plate CST3526 stolen from a rural property in the RM of Eldon. There are no leads or investigational avenues at this time.
- May 04, members received a report of an assault that occurred in the RM of Wilton. Assault occurred in the workplace and investigation is ongoing.
- May 04, members responded to a report of unwanted persons on property in the Town of Marshall. Members attended but persons were already gone. Members patrolled the area in an attempt to locate them but were unable to do so.
- On May 05, members responded to a report of unwanted persons at a residence in the Town of Lashburn. Members attended, located the people, and relocated them to Lloydminster.
- On May 5, members received a request in the RM of Wilton to assist a person in obtaining property back from a residence they had moved out of. Members attended and mediated the situation.
- On May 05, members received a report of children running and playing in the street in the Town of Marshall. Members attended, spoke with the children, and requested that they no longer play on the street.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

- On April 23, members responded to a collision at the intersection of 21Hwy and 16Hwy in the RM of Eldon involving two commercial vehicles. No injuries were reported. Both highways closed while clean-up was conducted. Traffic tickets were issued to one of the drivers after investigation.
- On April 24, members attend a single-vehicle collision with a commercial vehicle that had rolled into the center median of 16Hwy near Paynton SK. Collision found to be result of poor weather conditions. No injuries reported.
- On April 24, members responded to a single vehicle roll over involving a passenger vehicle on 16Hwy in the RM of Marshall. Collision found to be result of poor weather conditions. No injuries reported.
- On April 24, members on patrol located a vehicle in the ditch on 16Hwy at Lashburn SK. Collision due to icy road conditions. No injuries reported.
- On April 25, members responded to a single vehicle roll over involving a commercial vehicle on 16Hwy in the RM of Marshall. Collision a result of poor weather conditions. Driver of vehicle taken to hospital for treatment of non-life threatening injuries.
- On May 01, members responded to a two vehicle collision in the RM of Eldon at the intersection of 16Hwy and Railway Ave. Investigation showed that one vehicle turned into the oncoming traffic when unsafe to do so. No injuries were reported and a ticket was issued.
- On May 01, members responded to a cell phone crash notification on 16Hwy in the RM of Eldon. Investigation showed that one driver was re-entering traffic from the side of the road when they were struck in the rear by another vehicle on the highway. Investigation is ongoing.

- On May 01, members responded to a single vehicle collision on 17Hwy in the RM of Britannia. Investigation showed that a vehicle had hit a guardrail and was now parked on the side of the road. Investigation is ongoing.
- On May 06, members responded to a two-vehicle collision in the RM of Wilton. Investigation showed that one vehicle did not obey the yield sign and cut off the other vehicle. No injuries were reported, ticket issued.
- On May 06, members stopped a vehicle for failure to wear a seatbelt. Investigation showed other issues and driver failed a roadside breath test. Tickets issued, license suspended, and vehicle impounded.

WANTED

Brad MILLARD (50) of Maidstone, Saskatchewan is wanted for two counts of mischief under \$5000-damage to property and failure to appear in court.

Shawn WHITNEY (21) of Waseca, Saskatchewan is wanted for theft under \$5000-theft of gas and failure to appear for court.

Stuart MARTELL (36) of Onion Lake, Saskatchewan is wanted for unsafe storage of firearms, carrying a concealed weapon, unauthorized possession of a firearm/prohibited weapon, possession of firearm/weapon/device ammunition in motor vehicle, adult possession of restricted firearm/prohibited weapon with ammo without license/registration, fail to comply with release order condition and failure to appear in court.

Jeffrey MCLEAN (41) of Lloydminster, Saskatchewan is wanted for operation while prohibited, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal to \$5000, pursuit involved – flight from peace officer, dangerous operation of motor vehicle, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal \$5000, and operation while prohibited.

Trevor ROSS (47) of Edson, Alberta is wanted for two counts of possession for the purpose of trafficking, selling of tobacco products and raw leaf tobacco, sell, offer for sale, or have in his possession a tobacco product unstamped and possess, store transport or sell tobacco that is not marked in a prescribed manner, fail to comply with release order condition, and fail to attend court.

Troy CAMPBELL (35) of Lloydminster, Alberta is wanted for theft under \$5,000, mischief under \$5,000 – damage to property, and fail to attend court x 2.

VULNERABLE SECTOR CHECKS

A vulnerable sector check is a police information check plus a check to see if a person has a record suspension (pardon) for sexual offences. Vulnerable sector checks were created in 2000 to protect children and vulnerable persons and is governed by section 6.3(3) of the [Criminal Records Act](#). Policies and procedures related to vulnerable sector checks can be found in the [Dissemination of Criminal Record Information policy](#) and the *Ministerial Directive Concerning the Release of Criminal Record Information by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police*.

Employment or Volunteering in the Vulnerable Sector

People who volunteer or are employed in positions of trust or authority over children or vulnerable persons may be required to obtain a vulnerable sector check. **Being in a position of trust or authority is more than having random or chance care and authority with children or vulnerable persons.** To meet the legal requirements for a vulnerable sector check, **the nature of the position** must cause the person to have authority over, or trust of, children or vulnerable persons. A “vulnerable person” is defined as any person who, because of age, a disability, or other circumstances, whether temporary or permanent are: in a position of dependence on others or are otherwise at a greater risk than the general population of being harmed by a person in a position of authority or trust.

Process for getting a vulnerable sector check

The applicant must provide a letter from the organization clearly explaining how a position's duties meet the criteria for a VS check. Each letter is specific to the position and is used for that one application only. It can't be a generic form letter or be used for different positions. Details about the children or vulnerable persons (e.g. age, or other factors that can show how the person is vulnerable). If the position is volunteer, provide a letter from the organization stating the person will not be paid for services or any other personal expenses incurred.

Once the police service has determined that the **position** meets the requirements for a vulnerable sector check, a name-based search will be conducted. In some circumstances, you will be required to submit fingerprints to confirm your identity. The use of fingerprints ensures the accuracy of the identification process.

Denying vulnerable sector checks

The police service will use information submitted by the applicant to determine if the position meets the legal requirements to conduct a vulnerable sector check. If the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#) for a vulnerable sector check, the vulnerable sector check will not be completed.

Did you know?

It is an offence to conduct a vulnerable sector check if the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#).
