



## MAIDSTONE RCMP REPORT

**For the dates of: January 15, 2025 – January 26, 2026, Maidstone RCMP responded to 152 calls for service, some of which include:**

9 traffic collisions  
95 provincial traffic offences  
3 mischief

### CALLS FOR SERVICE:

- On January 15<sup>th</sup>, members responded to an abandoned and burnt truck left on rural property in the RM of Eldon. The registered owner was identified and found to be a victim of mischief.
- On January 15<sup>th</sup> members responded to a call of a vehicle stuck in the ditch on RR 3224 in the RM of Eldon. Members found a truck that Truck slid into the ditch. The vehicle was not obstructing traffic and members were unable to contact the registered owner. With no obvious criminal involvement the vehicle was left for the owner to deal with.
- On January 15<sup>th</sup> complainant reported an abandoned car on Range Road 3264 in the RM of Britannia. Members attended and discovered that the vehicle had been stolen from North Battleford and had been involved in additional offences in Lloydminster. The vehicle was towed to the Lloydminster RCMP Detachment for additional investigation.
- On January 15<sup>th</sup> complainant reported someone caused mischief to an engine shack on a lease site in the RM of Britannia. The complainant attempted to speak with the driver of a black Ford F150 driving slowly away but the driver ignored the complainant. Members made patrols but were unable to locate the suspect vehicle.
- On January 16<sup>th</sup> members received a report of dogs on the loose in Lashburn SK. The complainant knew the owner and requested a wellbeing check on them. Members attended and spoke with the owner of the dogs who got them under control and was well. Members had no concerns for the wellbeing of the owner.
- On January 17<sup>th</sup> members received a request from the Lloydminster RCMP to check on patient in Marshall SK whom the Lloydminster Hospital staff were concerned about. Members located the patient with a friend and found her to be well and had no concerns for her safety.
- On January 17<sup>th</sup> members received a report from a woman in Lashburn SK who was receiving unwanted text messages. Members investigated and found that there were no grounds for a charge at this time. The message sender was contacted and requested to not further contact the complainant.
- On January 19<sup>th</sup> members received a request for a wellbeing check on a person in the Britannia RM. Family were concerned due to possible additions issues and erratic text messages. Members attended and spoke with the person and found no concerns for their safety.
- On January 19<sup>th</sup> members received a report from a woman in Paynton SK that their ex-landlord was not allowing them to get their belongings. Members attended to mediate the situation and the complainant was able to get their belongings.
- On January 20<sup>th</sup> phone call to report a black Nissan Sentra with a badly smashed windshield driving on Highway 16 East of Lloydminster. The vehicle was reported to be unable to maintain its' lane and was travelling at 60km/h. Maidstone RCMP and RM of Wilton Police made patrols but were unable to locate the vehicle.
- On January 20<sup>th</sup> members responded to a residential alarm in the RM of Wilton. The alarm company and the RCMP were unable to get in touch with the homeowner. Members went to the residence and saw no footprints in the snow or indication that a break-in had occurred.
- On January 21<sup>st</sup> members responded to a call of a collision on 21 Highway in the RM of Eldon. Members attended with EMS and Fire Rescue. On scene member discovered that a collision occurred on the highway between a passenger vehicle and a commercial truck. The driver of the truck was uninjured but the occupants of the passenger vehicle suffered injuries. Traffic was temporarily blocked in both lanes while Fire Rescue extracted the occupants of the passenger vehicle. All occupants were transported to hospital for treatment. Investigation in this matter is still ongoing.
- On January 21<sup>st</sup> members responded to a complaint of a suspicious vehicle parked at a business in Waseca SK. The caller reported that there appeared to be one person in the vehicle and that the vehicle keeps turning on/off. Members attended and spoke with the lone male occupant who was tired and had pulled over to sleep before continuing their travels.

- On January 21st members received a commercial alarm at a business in Lashburn SK. Members attended and found that there was nobody on site, the doors were secured, and there were no signs of forced entry.
- On January 22<sup>nd</sup> member received a call of unwanted person at a residence in Maidstone SK. Members attended and were told that the unwanted person had left in a vehicle prior to police arriving. The complainant declined to answer any questions about the unwanted person so no further action will be taken.
- On January 23<sup>rd</sup> members received a report of vehicle mischief in Maidstone SK. The caller reported that an unknown person had drilled into his gas tank and had stolen gas. This matter is still under investigation.
- On January 23<sup>rd</sup> members received a report of threats in Maidstone SK. The caller reported that he was threatened while he was at a business in Maidstone SK. The caller reported that they did not know the person who had threatened them and declined to participate further in the investigation.
- On January 24<sup>th</sup> call reporting smoke and flames just south of Lashburn SK. The caller was concerned as they believed it to be a structure fire. Legacy Fire Department was contacted and they advised that it was a controlled burn.
- On January 24<sup>th</sup> members received a fraud report. Caller paid deposit of \$1000 for a truck with promise from the seller that it could be returned if the caller wasn't satisfied. After viewing the vehicle the caller requested the return of their deposit and was denied. While unfortunate, the caller was informed that this was a civil matter and not something that the police could intervene in.
- On January 26<sup>th</sup>, members received a report of a suspicious vehicle in Lashburn SK. A truck was idling near the caller's property with the lights off, then an unknown person in black approached the vehicle and drove it away. Members made patrols of the area and located the vehicle. The driver explained his activity and police had no concerns. A warning ticket was given for unrelated Traffic Safety Act matter.
- On January 26<sup>th</sup> a call was received of a male wearing all black sitting/curled up on the East side of Highway 17 in the RM of Britannia. Members attended with EMS the male was examined by EMS and transported to hospital for treatment.
- On January 26<sup>th</sup>, members received a report of a suspicious vehicle in the RM of Britannia. Caller reported that there was a car at the end of their driveway. Another vehicle was seen driving up and picking up the occupants of the first car and leaving. Member attended and learned that the vehicle was not reported stolen. The vehicle was partially blocking the driving lane and was towed for the safety of roadway users.

## TRAFFIC SAFETY

- On January 15<sup>th</sup>, members spoke with a driver during a checkstop at the Department of Highways Scales near Marshall SK. The driver of the commercial vehicle showed signs of intoxication and admitted to drug use. As a result of investigation, a male from Lloydminster AB was charged with possession of cannabis in a vehicle and tested positive for THC. The driver received a 3-day license suspension and the commercial vehicle was impounded.
- On January 15<sup>th</sup>, members spoke with a driver during a checkstop at the Department of Highways Scales near Marshall SK. Members observed that the vehicle smelled of burnt cannabis and that the driver showed signs of intoxication and admitted to drug use. As a result of investigation, a male from Edmonton AB tested positive for THC, received a 3-day license suspension, and their vehicle was impounded.
- On January 16<sup>th</sup>, members stopped a vehicle on 17 Highway in the RM of Britannia for a violation of the Vehicle Equipment Regulations Act. Investigation showed that the driver of the vehicle was a suspended driver. As a result of investigation, a female from Onion Lake SK was charged with driving without a license and their vehicle impounded.
- On January 17<sup>th</sup>, members stopped a vehicle on 17 Highway for violation of the Vehicle Equipment Regulations Act. The driver showed signs of intoxication and the member smelled burnt cannabis coming from the vehicle. The driver subsequently tested positive for THC. As a result of investigation, a female from Onion Lake SK was issued a 30-day license suspension and her vehicle was impounded for 30 days. The driver received a 30-day suspension and impound because this was their second time testing positive for THC while operating a vehicle within one year.

## WANTED

**Brad MILLARD** (50) of Maidstone, Saskatchewan is wanted for two counts of mischief under \$5000-damage to property and failure to appear in court.

**Shawn WHITNEY** (21) of Waseca, Saskatchewan is wanted for theft under \$5000-theft of gas and failure to appear for court.

**Dezmon-Ray ARMSTRONG** (26) of North Battleford, Saskatchewan is wanted for assault while choking, suffocating or strangling, uttering threats against a person and failure to appear in court.

**Rylan LINDSAY** (44) of Neilburg Saskatchewan is wanted for taking a motor vehicle without consent and failure to appear in court.

**Stuart MARTELL**, 36, of Onion Lake, Saskatchewan is wanted for unsafe storage of firearms, carrying a concealed weapon, unauthorized possession of a firearm/prohibited weapon, possession of firearm/weapon/device ammunition in motor vehicle, adult possession of restricted firearm/prohibited weapon with ammo without licence/registration, fail to comply with release order condition and failure to appear in court.

**Jeffrey MCLEAN** (41) of Lloydminster, Saskatchewan is wanted for operation while prohibited, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal to \$5000, pursuit involved – flight from peace officer, dangerous operation of motor vehicle, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal \$5000, and operation while prohibited.

**Justin NOETH** (35) of Paradise Hill Saskatchewan is wanted for failing to comply with a probation order and failure to appear in court.

**Riley THIESSEN** (49) of Shipman, Saskatchewan is wanted for assault with weapon and mischief under \$5,000 – damage to property.

**Stanley WHITEFISH** (49) of North Battleford Saskatchewan is wanted for operation of a motor vehicle while impaired, operation of a motor vehicle while prohibited, and failure to appear in court.
